Student Reports

Student semester reports will be distributed this week. I congratulate all students on the efforts they have put in. Special mention must go to our Kindergarten students who have worked extra hard and have made terrific gains in all learning areas.

One area of the report that can sometimes cause confusion is the use of the A-E scale:

It is important to remember that the achievement grades are used state-wide. Your child's work is being assessed against all the other children in NSW in the same grade. 'C' is the midpoint – this means children are working at the expected levels for his/her grade.

These reports represent the work of two terms. A student may receive a Sound [C] for a subject and then receive the same grade at the end of the year. That's OK! It means they have developed their understandings by six months since the last report.

Sound [C] – the student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.

Basic [B] – The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a basic level of competence in the processes and skills.

Limited [D] – The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

High [B] – The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.

Outstanding [A] – The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.

As always if you have any queries regarding your child's learning progress please make an appointment to speak with the class teacher.
