SWIMMING FOR SPORT – Term 4

A note will be sent home towards the end of Term 3 inviting students in Years 3 – 6 to participate in swimming for Friday sport during Term 4.

The Wyoming Public School Friday swimming program is run by teachers from our school who are also qualified swimming instructors (AustSwim). In the program, students are grouped according to their swimming ability after an initial assessment, then teachers focus on the skills their graded group

requires: this could be water familiarisation, water safety, breathing or stroke-correction.

Swimmers walk to the 5-Star Swim Centre at Brooks Avenue, Wyoming, swim in lessons (not water play) for one hour, then walk back to school. Interest in the program is significant with all places being filled within the first day or two after notes are distributed. In the past, some students drop out of the program after a few weeks. *Drop-outs can significantly affect supervision of students by teachers who remain at school and impacts on the grouping and lessons for swimmers. Drop-outs also mean that students who are waiting for a place on the reserve list will miss out on the beginning lessons.*

Please use the next few weeks to talk to your child about participating in this program. Swimming is an invaluable life skill but we ask that students who gain a swimming place commit to the full term so that other students are not unduly affected.
