#### Hats

I have noticed recently that lots of children are coming to school without a hat. Even though we are in winter, hats are required all year round for children to have access to the playground. They also need hats to be able to fully participate in any outdoor learning opportunities and sport. School hats are available for purchase from the canteen for \$14, but any wide-brimmed bottle green hat will do. As with all property, **please write your child's name clearly so that if it gets lost, it can be returned!**

Regular attendance at school has a meaningful impact on student wellbeing and academic achievement, as well as creating a solid foundation for future success. There are of course times when children cannot attend school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- Being sick or having an infectious disease
- Having an unavoidable medical appointment
- Being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- Exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral.

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.

Please pay particular attention to the attendance information included on the school report. Missing one day per fortnight (a total of 10 days in Semester 1) adds up to missing 4 weeks of school over the year, and over 1 year of schooling lost over a school life. Missing school also has significant social implications. Children struggle to maintain relationships with their peers if their attendance is inconsistent.

Please commit to sending your child to school on time every day. Regular absences can really add up and have significant impact on wellbeing and school achievement.

#### Nationally Consistent Collection of Data

The NCCD is an annual data collection that requires information on the extent of adjustments made for students with disability. In this newsletter, you will find some important information about this process, and I encourage you to have a look. Please contact Michelle Francis at school if you have any questions or concerns.

#### Reports

Our teachers have been very busy over the last few weeks finalising assessments and writing Semester 1 reports. The reports will be coming home in the last week of school this term and provide you with information on your child's progress, effort and development of social skills.
