THERAPY AT SCHOOL

Like all schools, we have several children who benefit from different allied health therapy such as speech therapy, physiotherapy and occupational therapy. In most cases, these therapies can be delivered at home or in a therapist's office. However, there may be some circumstances where therapy may be best delivered in school during school time.

The NSW Department of Education and the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) recommend that therapy services funded through a child's NDIS support plan are best delivered outside of school time. This allows the school to focus on teaching your child and all other students and ensures your child does not miss out on important learning time.

If you would like to request therapy for your child at school during school hours, please make a formal request in writing. Make sure to include all the reasons why the therapy is best delivered at school. This request, along with the goals of the therapy, will then be considered by the Learning and Support Team. The team will consider the impact on the individual student, the disruption to the class and the ability of the school to appropriately supervise the sessions. Each case will be considered individually. Please note that in our experience, occupational therapy is more effective if delivered in the therapy office as it is often not possible to accommodate the equipment necessary.

Is your child starting school next year? Headstart Transition to School Program

In 2022, Wyoming Public School will be offering a 26-week transition to school program. It will begin in Term 2 on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Parents select the day that best suits them. Please note that any changes to COVID-19 guidelines and restrictions could impact the running of Headstart.

This comprehensive program supports children in the year prior to Kindergarten. It is open to children living within the Wyoming Public School zone who will be attending our school in 2023.

Its goal is to facilitate a smooth transition to 'Big School' through the development of social skills, motor skills, language, independence and the familiarisation of basic school routines.

NSW HEALTH PRIMARY SCHOOL DENTAL PROGRAM

NSW Health is working with public primary schools to offer <u>free dental check-ups</u> and preventive care to students as part of a school-based mobile dental program. Wyoming Public School has been selected to participate in this program.

The program involves a mobile dental team making scheduled visits to our school. During the first appointment a dental check-up and preventive care package will be provided, subject to parental consent. A letter will be sent to parents/guardians providing an update on the child's dental check-up.

The program is scheduled to visit WPS from 27/04/2022 to 13/05/2022.

Parent Information and Consent Packs have been sent home, including information sheets, consent forms and the program privacy statement. Parents/guardians who want their child to receive care are advised to:

- 1. Read all the information provided
- 2. Carefully complete the consent forms
- 3. Return the consent forms to the school **BEFORE FRIDAY 1 APRIL**


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
