P&C UPDATE

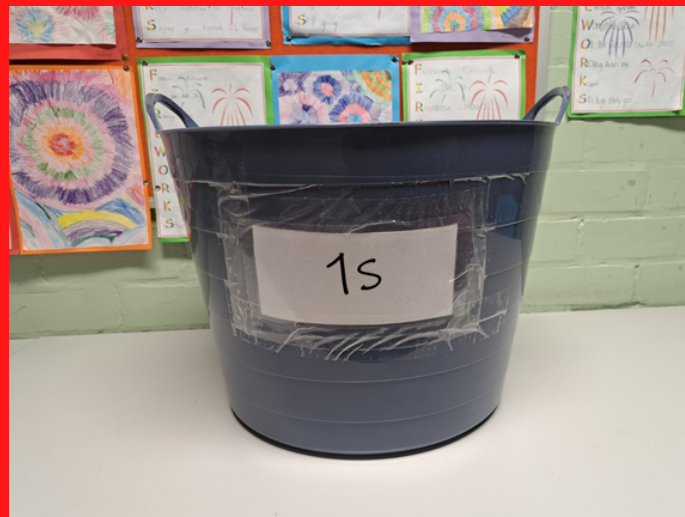
Welcome to Term 3!

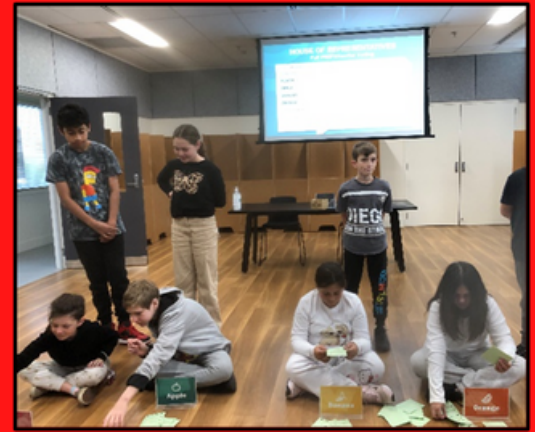
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STAGE 3 CAMP - CANBERRA

DAY 2:

Activities on this day included a visit to Parliament House (where we all met our local member, Emma McBride), saw some MPs debating in the House of Reps and Senate and got to role play a session of parliament. We had a guided tour of both the National Museum and War Memorial (and impressed the guides with our extensive knowledge of Gallipoli). Our bus drivers drove around the embassies and we tried to guess the countries represented by the architecture.
