### **COMMUNICATING WITH THE SCHOOL**

### IS YOUR EMAIL ADDRESS UP TO DATE?

As we complete our move across to SENTRAL it has come to our attention that some families have changed their email address since completing their Child's enrolment form.

A simple way to check this is by the school photo email that was sent on 7 March 2024 – if you received this email to the correct address, you do not need to take further action. ### **FEELING SCRATCHIE?**

Nits (lice) are one the of joys of every school setting – it is a good idea to make a quick hair check part of your weekly routine with your child.





There are plenty of ways to treat nits (including using lotions available from the supermarket/pharmacy) however one of the most effective and cost friendly methods is to smother your child's hair in thick (cheap) white conditioner, baby oil, mayonnaise, olive oil or coconut oil and leave for at least 1 hour. This will suffocate the adult lice.

Then use a nit comb to comb out everything that you see in your child's hair (including eggs). The trick to this method is to repeat once per week for another 2-3 sessions or until you see no evidence of lice in the hair.

Make sure you check the hair of everyone in your household.

There is conflicting information on whether all bed linen and towels of the infected person need to be washed. Personally, I would err on the side of caution as regardless of nits or no nits there is no better feeling than falling into a bed made up with clean sheets!


