HELLO DINGO INCURSION - 18/20.06.2024

In week 8, Stage 2 had the most wonderful opportunity to meet two real live dingoes! Students were treated to a Q & A session with Rob the dingo handler, who shared his wealth of knowledge about dingoes and told us the rescue story of his dingoes, Flynn and Bindi. Some students were lucky enough to have an even closer encounter with the dingoes and actually pat them or feed them treats!

We learnt lots of amazing facts about dingoes in addition to what we have already been learning in class this term. For example, did you know that dingoes are found everywhere in Australia except for Tasmania?

It was great to see the students have a real dingo experience as we are finishing off our 'Wandi' text study unit. This novel is based on a true story about a dingo pup who was attacked by an eagle, rescued by a kind-hearted human and delivered to a sanctuary. Wandi still lives today at the Dingo Discovery Sanctuary and Research Centre in Victoria.

NSW STATE LIBRARY VISIT - FAR OUT! TREASURES TO THE BUSH! - 19.06.2024

In week 8, Stage 2 received a free visit from the NSW State Library in Sydney who brought a variety of historical presentations, costumes and artifacts to share with us. This came at a great time as next term, we will be studying 'First Contacts' in History.

The presenters took us on a historical journey of the different explorers and navigators from Europe who stumbled upon Shark Bay in Western Australia hundreds of years ago. Some very enthusiastic students were chosen to portray these characters and tell the story of how Australia was 'discovered' by Europeans and slowly mapped over time.

Students were also lucky enough to view some artifacts which were hundreds of years old including a journal written in 1619, with a drawing of Dirk Hartog's ship. There was also a pocket globe which was used by navigators in 1754! William Dampier's map was also on display which was drawn in 1703 and shows a half-drawn map of 'New Holland', now known as Australia!
