PEER SUPPORT

Our Peer Support program is well underway. The leaders are to be highly commended on the way they care for and support the students in their groups, their preparation each week and commitment to doing their best. As the 'pioneers' of our Peer Support program – they have set a very high standard for the junior students when they become leaders in the years to come. Well done Stage 3!

So far in our focus on Keeping Friends, our Peer Support Stage 3 leaders have led the students in:

- · looking at the qualities their friends may have and the concept that we choose friends based on the qualities we admire in them
- · types of friendships 'best friends', 'friends', 'people we know' and the fact that friendships can change over time for various reasons
- · the importance of support networks and the role friends play in each other's lives
- · how to maintain friends, build positive relationships and the importance of taking turns and having consistent rules throughout a game
- · how to join groups and accepts others into their friendship groups. Student will have a chance to practice these skills as well as how to say no in a respectful way so they don't lose friends

The final weeks' sessions will focus on:

- · skills of winning in a friendly way and coping with losing accepting the outcome of a game, no matter what it is, in a friendly way in order to maintain friendships
- · playing a board game, where they will reinforce all the concepts and skills learnt during the program about being a good friend and the skills needed to maintain friendships and make new friends.

The trip home was far quieter than the trip there and I am sure the kindy kids all slept very well that night. The staff certainly did!










