National Reconciliation Week

National Reconciliation Week is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

The week runs from 27 May to 3 June every year. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey – the successful 1967 referendum and the High Court Mabo decision.

The theme for National Reconciliation Week this year is 'Bridging Now to Next'. Bridging Now to Next calls on all Australians to step forward together, to look ahead and continue the push forward as past lessons guide us.

Reconciliation must live in the hearts, minds and actions of all Australians as we move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider Australian community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

We all have a role to play when it comes to reconciliation, and in playing our part we collectively build relationships and communities that value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, histories, cultures, and futures.

FORTNIGHTLY AWARDS EXPLAINED

PRINCIPAL AWARDS

Class Awards (Coloured Awards)

Staff members give coloured awards for any action that deserves recognition. These awards are used for positive reinforcement and are usually kept at school (especially in the younger grades). Once a student has 10 coloured awards (within the current year), they are given to the classroom teacher who requests a Principal Award to be processed.

Certificates of Merit (White Award)

Certificates of Merit are awarded during our fortnightly K-6 assembly. Recipients of this award are chosen by the classroom teacher to recognise substantial achievement, improvement or citizenship. They need to be stored securely at home as they count towards receiving a Honour Certificate.

Principal Awards (White Award)

A Principal Award is awarded to students who have achieved 10 coloured awards (within the current year). These awards are presented at our fortnightly K-6 assembly and need to be stored securely at home as they count towards receiving a Honour Certificate.

Honour Certificate

This is our highest level of award and is achieved over several years. Students notify their teacher when they have received 10 White Awards who requests a Honour Certificate to be processed. Certificates are presented during the fortnightly K-6 assembly. Students who receive an award also enjoy a special Principal's morning tea at the end of each term.

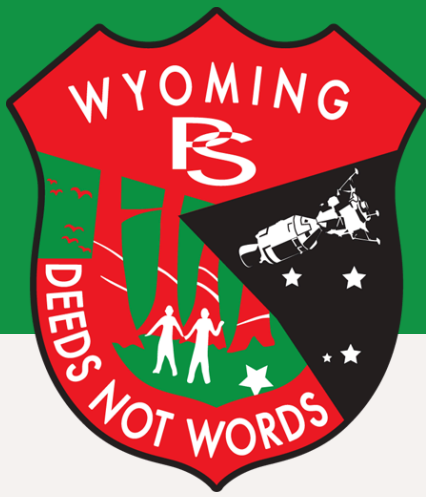

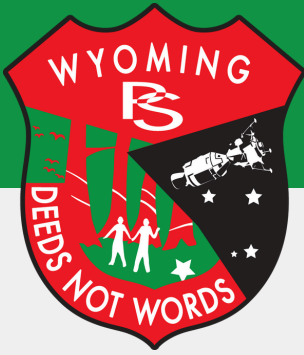

HEADSTART 2025

At Wyoming Public School we recognise the importance of a positive transition to school for children and their families by offering our 16-week Headstart transition program for those who reside within our intake area.

The Headstart program gives children a strong and successful start to school by establishing genuine relationships between students, families and staff. It supports the development of social skills, language and fine motor skills in a play based, fun and caring environment.

WHAT MAKES THE HEADSTART PROGRAM SO SUCCESSFUL?

- It encourages interaction, sharing, and cooperation with peers in a fun environment.
- It gives an opportunity for our staff to work closely with you, your child, and your child's preschool, allowing for a smooth and seamless start to school.
- Parents receive resources and guidance for supporting your child's development.
- Families connect with other parents for a supportive community.

Families choose to attend on either Mondays or Tuesdays. It is important to note that Headstart is not designed to replace a child's attendance at Pre-School.

Need a new Opal card?

To replace a lost or stolen School Opal card, scan the QR code or visit transportnsw.info and follow the prompts.

The usual \$10 fee will be waived if you order between 1 March and 12 April.*



It is a condition of the *School Pass Terms* and the *Student Codes of Conduct* when travelling that students in possession of the School Opal card must tap on and tap off every time when using public transport to travel to and from school. Per section 3.2 of the Opal Privacy Policy, Transport for NSW collects information from taps on and taps off to support coordination, planning and policy development for transport, transport services and transport infrastructure.

*Offer only applicable for eligible school students. Fee waived for one card per child only.
