Excursion Information: Annual Swimming Carnival

It's on again!

DATE: Friday, 14 February 2020

TIME: 9.30am – 2.00pm **VENUE:** Gosford Olympic Pool

COST: \$5.00 includes bus fare and pool entry

Children in Years 3 to Year 6 will be attending the swimming carnival as part of our school sport program. Year 2 students who turn (or have turned) 8 years old this year may attend the carnival <u>only if they are able</u> to compete in the 50m freestyle, breaststroke, backstroke or butterfly events.

Entry in races will be according to the age the student turns (or has turned) this year to comply with Zone swimming regulations.

Novelty events will be held throughout the day unless a student is identified as a "non-swimmer".

Children will travel to the pool by bus but may return home with their parent after having their name marked off the class roll by their class teacher. Buses will leave school at 9.05 am and return by 2.40pm.

Students are to be dressed in full sports uniform and are required to bring:

Swimmers (worn under school clothes)	Lunch and recess
Towel	School hat and sunscreen
A change of underwear	Plastic bag for wet things
Goggles (if needed)	Water bottle

A plain t-shirt in student sport house colours is allowed, but not compulsory. No crepe paper (streamers) or coloured zinc is allowed, as a rule of Gosford Olympic Pool management.

Please ensure all personal items are labelled.

Money may be brought to the pool for spending at the shop to purchase drinks and iceblocks.

Students will sit in the covered grandstand according to sport house groups. The indoor pool complex is out of bounds for students. Families are welcome to sit with their children in the allocated grandstand area, however, students must remain in the grandstand at all times under the supervision of teachers.

If you are coming to enjoy the day, cost for spectators is \$3.00 (children under 5 who are not swimming are free) and if you or your non-school age children intend to swim in the indoor pools available to the public, normal pool entry applies upon entry. Please note that the wading pool has been booked by the school for novelty events. Families are asked not to approach the officials' recording desk at any time. Students and their families must leave the pool at the conclusion of the carnival. The carnival is on "rain, hail or shine" as the pool is fully booked.

Please return the permission note and money in an envelope marked *Swimming Carnival* with your child's name and class to the front office **no later than Tuesday 11 February** to allow for processing.
